

Luxury Homes in Williamsburg and Boerum Hill Embrace Parkside Living

Let's be honest, New York City isn't exactly known for its greenery. Sure, we've got Central Park and a few hidden garden gems, but when it comes to everyday, at-your-doorstep access to nature? That's rare. And that's exactly what makes two Brooklyn residences – One Domino Square in Williamsburg and Bergen in Boerum Hill – so special. These aren't just luxurious places to live; they're your personal backstage pass to beautiful parks, leafy views, and fresh air right in the heart of the city.

One Domino Square

Picture this: you wake up in a stunning, sky-high apartment at <u>One</u> <u>Domino Square</u>, grab your coffee, and take it to your balcony where the East River glistens and Domino Park unfolds beneath you like a giant green carpet. That's not a vacation, that's Tuesday.



Take <u>Residence 28D</u>, for example. It's perched up high with floor-toceiling windows and jaw-dropping views of the waterfront and skyline. But the real flex? You've got Domino Park as your backyard. Five acres of open lawns, beach volleyball, a dog run, and trails for running or biking, all just downstairs.

And if you'd rather chill than jog, the outdoor pool deck sits just above the park, so you can soak up the sun with sweeping vistas. Even better, Domino Square (right next door) hosts everything from art installations to outdoor movie nights. Living here feels like having your private resort – only it's Brooklyn, and cooler.

Bergen

Now let's head a few neighborhoods over to Boerum Hill, where <u>Bergen</u> is doing something different, but just as dreamy. This is a quieter, more grounded kind of luxury. Think: <u>townhouse</u> vibes with a secret garden twist.



From the moment you step inside Bergen, you're greeted by a gorgeous glass atrium that opens up to a lush courtyard. But this isn't your typical backyard. Designed by Patrick Cullina and DXA Studio, it's got cascading waterfalls, winding paths, and even above-ground stormwater features that are both eco-smart and seriously soothing.

The vibe here is forest-meets-brownstone. Native plants, seasonal blooms, and clever landscaping blur the line between inside and out, creating a peaceful little oasis in the middle of the city. And when you want to take your nature time to the next level, Bergen's rooftop park is waiting – complete with grassy lawns, fire pits, and dining nooks. Grab a book, sip some wine, and enjoy those Boerum Hill views.

Both One Domino Square and Bergen are flipping the script on what it means to live in NYC. Instead of squeezing in a sliver of green, they've embraced it, giving residents real, daily access to open air, sunshine, and space to breathe.
